From the Director

Thank you for joining us for COVID conscious live theatre. Our decision to present Almost, Maine, was born from a desire to bring safe (but exciting) art back into our community. Early discussions revolved largely around the challenges of achieving the required intimacy of Almost, Maine, while also taking the highest levels of safety precautions for our audience and actors. What resulted was the casting of two married couples, to play various roles. This casting allowed us to present their characters safely, while also providing the closest experience to pre-COVID theatre as possible.

Now more than ever art is needed in our communities to help bring us together and heal from the challenges 2020 has brought us. What better way to do that than a story about real, everyday people.

Almost, Maine is a play about what happens to people in a heartbeat. As you sit with us, you may recall past love, moments in your life both tender and painful. As is often the case with art, Almost, Maine puts a mirror to our lives. You just might see yourself or a version of yourself come alive on the stage. Primarily a comedy, this play is rich and layered – hardly a rehearsal went by without one of us discovering something new embedded in the dialogue.

You are entering Almost, Maine. No matter which performance you attend, the stories you see unfold occur within the same 15-minute period; Friday night, Nine O'clock, with the Aurora Borealis expected in the northern sky.

You'll be witness to endless possibilities for the residents of Almost, Maine: Blossoming new love, relationships ending, people moving forward in their lives, people examining their situations. What you will not witness, is the end of these possibilities. At the close of each scene, our characters are about to experience joy. Great Joy. But not yet... the lights fade on the moment of change, leaving you to fill in the final gaps of their journey. You're going to have to do a bit of work, a little thinking and a dash of feeling to complete the narrative yourself.
